
**Proclamation**

- WHEREAS,** the state of Louisiana recognizes its vital role in identifying, protecting its citizens from and responding to cyber threats that may have significant impact to our individual and collective security and privacy; and
- WHEREAS,** all aspects of Louisiana's economy are becoming increasingly reliant on technology, which exposes our computer networks and information systems to the risk of cyber-attacks; and
- WHEREAS,** the Louisiana Cybersecurity Commission was established in December 2017 to enhance and protect the state's cybersecurity ecosystem; and
- WHEREAS,** the state of Louisiana works with federal and private sector stakeholders to achieve cybersecurity that spans across state and local lines using a whole governmental approach; and
- WHEREAS,** critical infrastructure sectors are increasingly reliant on information systems and technology to support financial services, energy, telecommunications, transportation, utilities, health care and emergency response systems; and
- WHEREAS,** maintaining the security of cyberspace is a shared responsibility in which each of us has a critical role to play, and awareness of computer security essentials will improve the security of the state of Louisiana's information, infrastructure and economy; and
- WHEREAS,** Cybersecurity Awareness Month is intended to engage and educate public and private sector partners through events and initiatives to raise awareness about the importance of cybersecurity, provide them with tools and resources needed to stay safe online and increase the resiliency of the state of Louisiana in the event of a cyber incident.
- NOW, THEREFORE,** I, John Bel Edwards, Governor of the State of Louisiana, do hereby proclaim October 2019 as
